The children enjoyed it and an outside club was offered to the children. The children in year 5/6 attended the dance festival at Consett Empire Theatre. They performed in front of an audience which developed their confidence and performance skills. Children from year 3/4 took part in an athletics Quad Kids event at Greenland Primary School. 12 children from KS1 entered a World Cup festival – the children enjoyed learning about the world cup and competing against other schools.</p>
