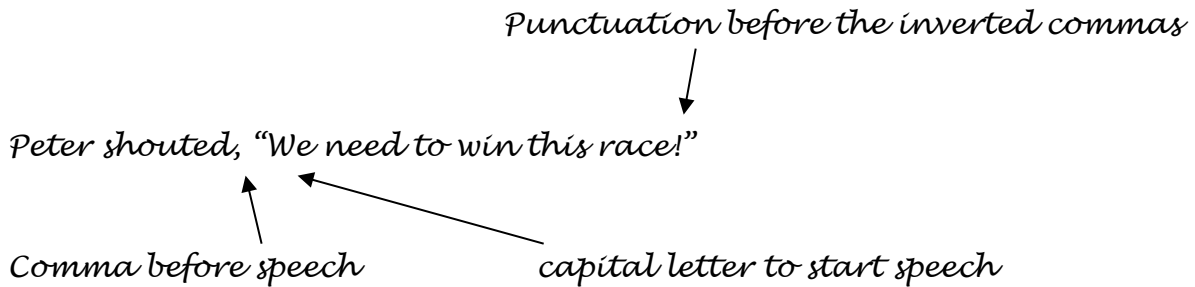


Inverted Commas

SUCCESS STEPS

- They go before the first word spoken and after the last word spoken not around who is speaking and how they are saying.
- Inverted commas go after all other punctuation, e.g. "How are you?" (remember there has to be some punctuation at the end of all speech)
- The first word in the speech needs to have a capital letter
- Broken speech doesn't need a capital letter at the start of the second part
- if the speech comes after the verb to show how you're speaking, you need to put a comma
