Attendance & Punctuality:

We are delighted so far, with the positive impact that our new Attendance Trophy has had. The Government set a target for every child of 96% attendance. If a child's attendance falls to 90% or below, it is classed as persistent absence and must be followed up swiftly and rigorously by the school. Each month, Mrs Coombe works with families to ensure that any persistently absent pupils, or those at risk of dropping to 90% or below are able to meet targets set for them to improve attendance. Our teachers plan amazing, lively and interesting learning opportunities for pupils of all needs and abilities and it is important that we work in partnership to ensure that all children access their full curriculum entitlement. Please support us in helping your child progress and achieve by ensuring that they attend and are punctual. Thank you.

E Safety at home- some tips you may like to consider:

As a parent you'll know how important the internet is to children - they use it to learn, play, socialise and express themselves. It's a highly creative place of amazing opportunities. But the technology children use every day can seem a bit daunting and you might worry about the risks your child can face online - such as contact from strangers or the possibility of them seeing illegal or inappropriate content. Here are some conversation starters from www.childnet.com that you may find helpful:

- Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online.
- Ask them about how they stay safe online. What tips do they have for you, and where did they learn them? What is OK and not OK to share?
- Ask them if they know where to go for help, where to find the safety advice, privacy settings and how to report or block the services they use.
- Think about how you use the internet as a family. What could you do to get more out of the internet together and further enjoy your lives online?
